## Newsletter 27, 28th July 2024 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time

"Painful to read, but not nearly as painful to endure", those were the personal words of Mr Luxon, in Parliament last Wednesday, apologising for the years of abuse and neglect people suffered in State and Faith based care in Aotearoa New Zealand.

This past week we've witnessed the public release of the Royal Commission of Inquiry into Abuse in Care. This has been the largest and most complex inquiry ever held in New Zealand. Lasting over six years, and spanning 7 decades, the voices of the survivors of abuse in State and Faith based care have been heard and believed. Many of the cases were historical and highlighted horrific abuse, and the failures of individuals to protect and ensure the safety of people in their care. Confronting these realities is a significant and necessary step.

The Catholic Church in Aotearoa New Zealand is a core participant in the Inquiry and Church leaders have been supportive of the Inquiry and the need for it. In 2018 when the Inquiry was established the terms of reference only included state care. Many people, including the bishops and congregational leaders asked for the scope of the Inquiry to be broadened to include faith-based institutions. Church leaders continue to acknowledge the Church's history and the on-going trauma of those who have been harmed. The Church's focus on safeguarding and care aims to ensure that people are safe in care today.

138 recommendations have been tabled as a result of this Inquiry, including formal apologies from both Government and Religious leaders. The Church is ready to review the Commission's Final Report and considerations that arise from it. Church leaders are already implementing several initiatives and made public their response.


