Newsletter 30, 18th August 2024 20th Sunday of Ordinary Time

On the 15th of August, Aotearoa celebrates it's patronal feast, where we affirm the dogma that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory upon completing her earthly life. Celebrating this feast in 2024 highlights the sanctity of our bodies and the salvation of the whole person. Mary, fully redeemed, shares in the risen life of her Son Jesus, embodying the resurrection and life everlasting as stated in the Creed.

Pope Francis, in his Exhortation Gaudete et Exsultate, praises Mary's unique embodiment of Jesus' Beatitudes, characterized by joy, contemplation, and mercy. As the supreme saint, Mary guides us in holiness and offers unwavering support. This message is crucial in 2024, reflecting our need for steadfast faith and compassion in a changing world.

The gospel reading for the Assumption, Luke 1:39-56, recounts Elizabeth's visit to Mary and the Magnificat. This hymn speaks of God's mercy, societal reversal, and divine justice, resonating with today's call for social justice amidst upheaval.

Pope Francis encourages simple prayer with Mary, such as the "Hail Mary." On 15 August, Aotearoa New Zealand celebrates its patronal feast of the Assumption, emphasizing Mary's role in Christian eco-spirituality and our duty towards creation. Pope Francis reminds us that our earthly actions impact our eternal future.

Mary, who cared for Jesus, now tends to our wounded world, urging action against poverty, injustice, and environmental destruction. In 2024, this call is urgent. We must live our faith by making a tangible impact, respecting the dignity of our bodies and others. The feast underscores the goodness of our bodies and the promise of salvation for the whole person. Mary, assumed into heaven, offers wisdom to address the world's suffering and our responsibilities to one another and to Earth, challenging us to create a just and compassionate world.
